By the end of this topic we will..

Art

Understand the work of Hans Holbein how he was influential upon society and in the work of other artists during the Tudor period

Have created a sketch book of designs based on the work of Hans Holbein portraits

Have used a number of different art mediums to sketch ideas.

Have perfected the use of brush techniques and skills and can use oil paints as a medium

Design and Technology

Have researched, designed, made and analysed our own picture frames.

Have used historical research to evaluate frame qualities from Tudor times.

Selected from a range of materials, the appropriate tool, for cutting the wood and mitring the edges according to its functionality.

Have evaluated the finished product against the design criteria.

Apply an understanding of how to strengthen and reinforce the frame.

Languages

Be able to speak in sentences, using familiar vocabulary, phrases and basic language structures, as Henry's wives.

Be confident with intonation and pronunciation of words and phrases

History

Explained the Tudors as a significant turning point in British and world history.

Developed a chronologically secure knowledge and understanding of British, local and world history during the Tudor reign.

Have understood the changing power of Monarchs for example Henry VIII power in the dissolution of the monasteries.

Have understood the changes in social history, such as crime and punishment and leisure, sports and entertainment— William Shakespeare and the Globe theatre.

Have explored Henry VIII's break with Rome.

Music

Have listened with attention, in detail and recall sounds with increasing aural memory

Have learned to sing and use their voices to create and compose music on their own and with others.

Be able to understand and explore how music was created and composed in Tudor times

Geography

Have developed a contextual knowledge of the locality and globally significant places within the Tudor era for use on trading routes.

Be able to use maps, globes and atlases to locate the world's countries especially within the "spice route trails"

Understand and explain how the Tudors used the sea and land to establish trade links for use by Sir Walter Raleigh to explore the globe.

Be able to use the 8 point compass, grid references and Ordnance Survey maps to build their knowledge of the UK and wider world

RE

Understand—What would Jesus do? (U2.2)

Understand and be able to discuss what it means to be a Muslim in Britain today? (U2.6)

PSHE

Understanding the concepts of difference and diversity' and relating this to Core British Values. To understand 'Being me' in modern society.

PE

Have taken part in outdoor athletic sessions .

Have used running, jumping, throwing and catching in isolation and in combination.

Have developed the ability to be physically active for sustained periods of time
